Rt of SARS-CoV-2 in Latin America

The initial stage of COVID-19
epidemic in LA suggested a high effective Rt of SARS-CoV-2
All LA countries had Rt >2

COVID-19 epidemic in Latin America

Challenges for COVID-19 epidemic control in the region

- High number of people living in conditions where social distancing and hand-washing are virtually impossible
 - Brazil has 13 million people living in *favelas*
- Latin America has one of the most overcrowded prisons worldwide
- Presence of competing epidemics (COVID-19 and dengue)
- Denial of the severity of the pandemic by political leaders
- Prioritization of the economic recover vis a vis the health of the population
- Shortage of PPE and ventilators/intensive care beds
- Limited testing capacity

Final Remarks

- Worldwide, more than 11 million cases of COVID-19 were confirmed and 545,000 deaths were caused by COVID-19 so far.
- The US and Latin America represent around 40-45% of all COVID-19 cases and deaths.
- Latin America is the new epicenter of COVID-19 pandemic Brazil, Peru and Chile are the top-10 leaders of cumulative COVID-19 cases.
- High transmission rates, specific characteristics and limited testing capacity might contribute to high impact of COVID-19 in Latin America
- •Social determinants of health play an important role in the pandemic impact in Brazil.
